Fumiko ARAKI, Ph.D

Born in Hiroshima City on April 5th, 1945, four months before the atomic bombing. Her family lived in Funairi Saiwaicho, 1.5 km (1 mile) from the hypocenter. But on that day,

her 12 year old brother went out for enforced building demolition service and never returned home.



Kazuhiko FUTAGAWA Born in Yaga-machi April 1st, 1946, eight months after the bombing. On August 7th, his pregnant mother was exposed to radiation when entering the

ground zero area to search for her missing husband and daughter.

Keiko OGURA Born August 4th, 1937. Experienced the atomic bombing at age eight as a 2nd grade elementary school student. She was on the road near her house in Ushita, 2.4

km (1.5 miles) from the hypocenter.
